- Haliburton Celtic Jam performing at 11 am. Local people who share a love of traditional Celtic fiddle music. The group includes musicians of varying abilities who play instruments such as: fiddle, guitar, flute, cello, mandolin, banjo, spoons, ugly sticks, etc.
